

City Council Meeting

May 24, 2017

Victor, ID

Victor City Council met in regular session in the Council Chambers in City Hall at 32 Elm Street at 7:00 P.M.

Mayor: Jeff Potter

Visitors:

Ed Berthoud with Teton Valley Youth Lacrosse Association made public comment requesting to place a storage container in the interior of Pioneer Park near the water storage tank. A motion was made by Councilwoman Absolon and seconded by Councilman Wells to approve the request made by Teton Valley Youth Lacrosse Association to place a storage container in the interior of Pioneer Park near the water storage tank and to direct staff to assist in moving and placing the container. Mayor Potter called for the vote. The vote showed all in favor. The motion carried.

Public Hearing/Possible Action Items.

Eclipse Plan. Rob Heuseveldt made staff comment regarding the upcoming workplan which stated that the cities first priorities are to maintain the water and sewer system and the cleanliness of parks and bathrooms at the Depot. The eclipse budget was also presented to Council, and a recommendation from staff for Council to cancel the August 23rd meeting.

A motion was made by Councilman Frohlich and seconded by Councilwoman Absolon to cancel the August 23rd City Council meeting unless pressing items require it to be rescheduled and authorize the eclipse budget as presented in the staff report.

Work Session:

Moonshine: 20 Minute Parking Zone Request: Rob Heuseveldt made staff comment in regards to a request made for Moonshine Liquor, Beer and Wine to convert four or five spaces in front of the business located at 170 North main to a 20 Minute parking zone, Rob discussed the concerns of not being able to monitor this request, further discussion was made with the concerns from Sheriff Liford. Eric and Kathy Spitzer made public comment on why they would benefit from a short-term parking in front of their property and that this would help with store front visibility for all business in that area. Further discussion was made by council with the concerns about the city staff and the local sheriff's office not being able to enforce this request, the possibly of an informative study provided through-out the city that could take place before we do short term parking.

A motion was made by Councilman Frohlich and seconded by Councilman Absolon to direct staff to pull historical studies done previously before on parking and begin to make a recommendation to look into parking on a city-wide basis. Mayor Potter called for the vote. The vote showed all in favor. The motion carried.

Irrigation Fee Analysis: Rob Heuseveldt made staff comment and presented his irrigation fee analysis report and that the purpose of this item is to propose a rate increase for the irrigation system with the interest to help the revenue deficit in the irrigation fund, and to establish a yearly fee that is fair and equitable for all users on the system. Marian Ruzicka made public comment regarding that golf vista subdivision shouldn't have to pay irrigation fee to the city as well as payments to their HOA for trail creek irrigation. Don Thompson made public comment regarding water rights to stay with the city. A motion was made by Councilman Wells and seconded by Councilman Green to move this item to a public hearing as soon as notice requirements can be met and to hold a second work session on June 14th

to go over Golf Vista Subdivision. Mayor Potter called for the vote. The vote showed all in favor. The motion carried.

Interim Ordinance O515 regarding Title 10, Chapter 12, Section 6, Parks in Relation to parks dedication: Josh Wilson made staff comment regarding the background and history of the current code, and his recommendations updating the requirements for park dedications in a subdivision. Don Thompson made public comment regarding his thoughts of high density residential project in the downtown core. A motion was made by Councilman Wells and seconded by Councilwoman Absolon to direct staff to place Ordinance O515 as presented with additional options for council to consider on the June 28, 2017 agenda for a public hearing and adding a second work session item for June 14th. Mayor Potter called for the vote. The vote showed all in favor. The motion carried.

Ordinance regarding Prohibiting Peddlers Licenses: City Attorney Herb Heimerl made staff comment regarding peddlers and transient merchants conducting business in the City.

A motion was made by Councilwoman Absolon and seconded by Councilman Frohlich to direct staff to put Ordinance O516 and Ordinance O517 as a decision item on June 14th agenda. Mayor Potter called for the vote. The vote showed all in favor. The motion carried.

Ordinances & Resolutions

Resolution R507- A Resolution Declaring the Eclipse as a Community Event, Authorizing Acceptance of Mass Gathering Applications and Outdoor Sales of the Downtown Area. City Attorney Herb Heimerl made staff comment regarding that this resolution will allow the city to start taking mass gathering applications and outdoor sales in the downtown area.

A motion was made by Councilman Frohlich and seconded by Councilman Green to approve Resolution R507, A resolution Declaring the Eclipse as a Community Event, Authorizing Acceptance of Mass Gathering Applications and Outdoor Sales of the Downtown Area. Mayor called for the vote. The vote showed all in favor. The motion carried.

Consent Calendar:

A motion was made by Councilman Wells and seconded by Councilwoman Absolon to approve the consent calendar as presented on the agenda excluding item 3- Special Events- Eclipse Information Center and item 4- Additional Power Source in the City Park. The consent calendar included the following:

1. To approve the May 10, 2017 Regular Meeting Minutes as presented.
2. To approve the Disbursements as presented.

Mayor Potter called for the vote. The vote showed all in favor. The motion carried.

Special Events- Eclipse Information Centers. Alan Allred made public comment regarding his interactions with the County and his recent conflict of interest and his role with the public sponsorship with port-a-potties for events. Discussion followed regarding the sale of alcohol for this event and requesting that Continental Divide Events inform Council and Staff if anything changes with this application and that the applicant provide the City with a complete list of items that will be made available for sale. Bill Boney made public comment regarding the plan of what will be at these locations regarding information and sells. A motion was made by Councilman Frohlich and seconded by Councilwoman Absolon to approve the Special Events- Eclipse Information Center application as presented. Mayor Potter called for the vote. The vote showed all in favor. The motion carried.

Additional Power Source in the City Park. Discussion followed regarding the additional power source in the city park and what it is used for. A motion was made by Council and seconded by Council to

approve the additional power source in the city park. Mayor Potter called for the vote. The vote showed all in favor. The motion carried.

Matters from Mayor, Council, & Staff

Mayor Potter reported on the school board update.

The dashboard was also included and contained information on citizen comments received, building and planning permits being processed, the proposed budget calendar, city administrator schedule, planning commission and VURA vacancies, Public Works projects and Arbor Day photos.

Adjourn. A motion was made by Councilman Wells and seconded by Councilwoman Absolon to adjourn the meeting. Mayor Potter called for the vote. The vote showed all in favor. The motion carries. The Meeting adjourned at 9:43 P.M.
